e is the base of natural logarithms, also known as Euler's number

$$e = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{1}{n!}$$

i.e. $(1 + 1/n)^n$, as n approaches infinity

i is the imaginary number that is the square root of -1

 π is the ratio between the circumference of a circle and its diameter


When I Am Happy


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HKE poetry with pitch profiles

Strategies for Confluence of Hearts in ELT

- a. Aim for clear diction, not dictionary diction. Intelligibility is not predicated on sounding like a dictionary.
- b. Be proud of your own speech patterns, and check on your own authenticity of emotions, clarity of thought and expression, and intelligibility to a wide and general audience.
- c. Guide students in clarity of expression, not in sounding foreign or local
- d. Do not favour or disfavour, reward or penalize "correctness" of pronunciation, but on effectiveness and precision of expression.
- e. Celebrate clear and creative use of local expressions that is accessible to others.
- f. Explain to parents, students, panel teachers, principals alike, that you're teaching students to be effective English language users, not in making them British or American.
- g. Make English a HK language, not HK an outpost of English speech.
